## FATHERHOOD

- Critical concern in our culture.
- Understand what being a father IS?
- Struggle with the definition of Manhood.
- Direct effect on the kind of Father they will be.

God has expectations about fatherhood:

- † Proverbs 1:8 NKJV
- † Proverb 6:20 NKJV
- † Proverbs 23:22 NKJV

The key to being the Father we should be and the Father we want to be is rooted in our relationship with the Heavenly Father!

#### INTRODUCTION

There is a certain pride children have when it comes to their father!

Proverbs 17:6 NKJV

<sup>6</sup> Children's children *are* the crown of old men, And the glory of children *is* their father.

There is also a certain attraction or desire children have for their father's approval.

QUESTION: "What kind of Father are You or Do You want to BE?"

Estimated 74 million dads in United States:

- 72 million of those are biological fathers.
- Of the 72 million biological fathers, 5.9 million or 8.2% have never been married.

Research shows that when fathers are involved, their children are:

- 2 times more likely to go to college.
- 80% less likely to spend time in jail.
- 75% less likely to experience teen pregnancy.

## FIVE EXAMPLES OF FAITHERS IN THE BIBLE:

1) ABRAHAM: \_\_\_\_\_\_ (Obedient) Father - Genesis 18:19 AMP



- a) KNOWN by God I have known him.
- b) OWNED by God Known him.

"Know" (Hebrew: yada) - knowledge of; experience, to care about or be concerned for.

- c) SHOWN by God So that he may teach and command his children and [the sons of] his household after him to keep the way of the Lord by doing what is righteous and just.
- d) ADORNED by God So that the Lord may bring upon Abraham what He has promised him.
- 2) ISAAC: \_\_\_\_\_\_ FATHER Genesis 25:28 AMP (also Genesis 27)



This is the father that shows favoritism - Preferring one child over other!

- a) Self-Serving Now Isaac loved [and favored] Esau, because he enjoyed eating his game.
- b) Schismatic (Divisive) Rebekah loved [and favored] Jacob.
- c) Seduced (taken advantage of) His wife and his son tricked Him (Ch.27)

Like the absentee father who hasn't left, his influence is not evident.
